The Bonfire night event was the first, of I hope many occasions where villagers and friends can socialise and enjoy each other's company, delivered by the combined efforts of the Parish Council and the Village Hall. I am sure a summer event will prove just as popular.

Crime in the village remains negligible, our accounts are robust and we do have real ambition to continue to work for you as a village to make Walton and even better place to live.

My thanks must be extended to all the Parish Councillors and the team involved in delivering the Parish Plan. In addition Helena Buck has continued to be superb in her position as Clerk, ensuring we run efficiently under ever increasing legislation, but most of all thank you to everybody who takes an interest, it is always a pleasure to take feedback, especially positive feedback!
